Driving Regulations

1. Parking for students will be on the upper end of the east parking lot.
2. Students need to be approved in order to drive to school. Only students listed on the application may ride with those who are driving. If a student needs to transport other students who are not approved passengers on their driving permit, a note from both parents must be brought to the office.
3. In order to leave due to sickness, etc. parental permission must be obtained by office personnel over the phone or by note.
4. A Christian testimony includes road courtesy and proper driving habits. Observation of a student operating a vehicle in a manner which reflects poor judgment, foolishness or unsafe procedure is grounds for revoking his/her driving privileges immediately.
5. Cars are to remain parked until a student leaves for the day. If a student needs to access his/her car during school hours, he/she must check in and out through the school office.
6. In order to leave before the buses, the following procedure must be followed:
 - A. Park in very north most area of student parking with vehicle facing west. (If you are not parked far enough north and a bus is loading in front of you, you may not leave before the buses.)
 - B. Exit on the blacktop before buses begin moving. Once buses begin moving student drivers who are not already on their way out must wait and follow the buses. The teacher on duty has authority to stop all traffic movement at any time.
 - C. Recognize that the SAFETY of ALL students is the primary concern. Any actions or behavior which jeopardizes this safety will have to be eliminated.
7. Students who are on behavioral probation will not be permitted to drive to school.
8. Students failing to take responsibility will be held accountable through the following procedure:
First offense - warning from principal.
Second offense - conference with principal and letter home to parents.
Third offense - loss of driving privileges for five school days.
Fourth offense - and thereafter - loss of driving privileges for 10 school days.
